ARTICLE II. FIRE CODE***Sec. 6-26. Adoption.**

That a certain document, three copies of which are on file in the office of the village clerk of the Village of Aroma Park, Illinois, being marked and designated as the NFPA 101 Life Safety Code as published by the National Fire Protection Association, be and is hereby adopted as the Code of the Village of Aroma Park, Illinois for regulating and governing the safeguarding of life and property from fire and explosion hazards arising from the storage, handling and use of hazardous substances, materials and devices, and from conditions hazardous to life or property in the occupancy of buildings and premises in the Village of Aroma Park, Illinois; and each and all of the regulations, provisions, conditions and terms of such NFPA 101 Life Safety Code, published by the National Fire Protection Association, on file in the office of the village clerk of the Village of Aroma Park, Illinois are hereby referred to, adopted and made a part hereof as if fully set out in this article.

Sec. 6-28. Geographic limits.

That the geographic limits referred to in certain sections of the *2003 International Fire Code* are hereby established as follows:

Section 3204.3.1.1 (geographic limits in which the storage of flammable cryogenic fluids in stationary containers is prohibited): "Village of Aroma Park"

***Editor's note**—Ord. No. 2001-07-02-C, §§ 1—4, adopted July 2, 2001, enacted provisions adopting the 2000 International Fire Code. Said ordinance did not specify manner of codification and has been codified as superseding the provisions of § 6-1 derived from the original Code.

Subsequently, Ord. No. 2004-04-13-C, adopted Apr. 13, 2004, repealed the former Art. II, §§ 6-26 and 6-27, and enacted a new Art. II as set out herein. The former Art. II pertained to similar subject matter. For complete derivation, see the Code Comparative Table at the end of this volume.

Section 3404.2.9.5.1 (geographic limits in which the storage of Class I and Class II liquids in above-ground tanks outside of buildings is prohibited): "Village of Aroma Park"

Section 3406.2.4.4 (geographic limits in which the storage of Class I and Class II liquids in above-ground tanks is prohibited): "Village of Aroma Park"

Section 3804.2 (geographic limits in which the storage of liquefied petroleum gas is restricted for the protection of heavily populated or congested areas): "Village of Aroma Park". (Ord. No. 2004-04-13-C, § 2, 4-13-04)
